- ▶ 23 total credits to graduate from CV
 - 4 credits in English
 - 3 credits in Social Studies
 - 3 credits in Science
 - 3 credits in Math
 - 2 additional credit in Science, Math, or Social Studies
 - 1.5 credits in Health & PE
 - Proficiency on state assessments/Keystones*
 - *Based on current legislation

Beginning with the Class of 2021

- Successful completion of a high school class while in middle school (with an 85% or higher) will receive high school credit
 - Algebra, Geometry, Algebra 2
 - Level 1 or 2 World Language
 - Courses will not count toward GPA or class rank

Semester III – Accelerated Course in Summer


- Open to students entering their sophomore, junior, or senior year






