2019 GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

- ▶ 23 total credits to graduate from CV
 - ▶ 4 credits in English
 - ▶ 4 credits in Social Studies (3 credits for CPAVTS)
 - ▶ 3 credits in Science
 - ▶ 3 credits in Math
 - ▶ 1 additional credit in Science or Math
 - ▶ 2 credits in Health & PE
 - ▶ completion of PA Keystone Exams
 - ▶ Seniors must schedule 5.5 credits

2020 GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

- ▶ 23 total credits to graduate from CV
 - ▶ 4 credits in English
 - ▶ 3 credits in Social Studies
 - ▶ 3 credits in Science
 - ▶ 3 credits in Math
 - ▶ 2 additional credits from any combination in Social Studies, Science and/or Math
 - ▶ 1.5 credits in Health & PE
 - ▶ completion of PA Keystone Exams
 - ▶ Juniors must schedule 6.5 credits

Semester III – Accelerated Courses in Summer

- ▶ Open to students entering their sophomore, junior, or senior year
- ▶ Limit 2 credits
- ▶ Blended format
- ▶ 6 week course (60 hours of face to face for full credit)
- ▶ 3 week courses (30 hours of face to face for ½ credit)
- ▶ 2 hours of homework each night

Semester III – Accelerated Courses Continued

- ▶ American Govt (.5 credit)
- ▶ Contemporary Global Issues
- ▶ Economics (.5 credit)
- ▶ United States History
- ▶ Computer Networking
- ▶ Health & Physical Education (.5 credit)
- ▶ American Literature 11
- ▶ World Literature 12
- ▶ Geometry
- ▶ Chemistry
- ▶ HACC Humanities

College in the High School/Dual Enrollment Program

- ▶ Agreement with HACCC for students to gain college credit as a student at Cumberland Valley
- ▶ Classes are taught by HACCC or CV faculty
- ▶ Dual Enrollment - Cost is \$100 per credit (\$300 total cost per class)
- ▶ CHS – Cost is \$50 per credit (\$150 total)
- ▶ Courses: refer to Program of Studies (POS)

College in the High School/Dual Enrollment

- ▶ Some courses have book fees.
- ▶ Placement test or pre-requisites required this spring (some courses)
- ▶ NCAA
- ▶ HACCC application (paper) pick up at CV

Early College Admission

- ▶ Program designed for seniors who want to complete their 12th grade required classes at a local college
- ▶ Pre-approval is required
- ▶ Students are responsible for tuition and transportation (do not qualify for Fin Aid)
- ▶ Application due March 1st of Junior Year

*** Partial Early College Admission is also available for seniors who would like to take some of their required classes at a local college

Blended Learning

- ▶ Traditional class setting every other cycle day
- ▶ Alternate cycle days, learning common location
- ▶ Courses listed in Program of Studies

Late Arrival/Early Release

- ▶ Opportunity for juniors and seniors in good standing to begin their day with 2nd period or end their day after 8th prd
- ▶ Need to be in good academic standing
- ▶ Parent permission signed off on course selection sheet
- ▶ Student/Athlete

NCAA ELIGIBILITY CENTER

- ▶ Must qualify to play in D1 and D2 sports
- ▶ Core courses used in determining eligibility
- ▶ Must have a minimum SAT/ACT score
- ▶ Students must register with Eligibility Center at the end of junior year at www.eligibilitycenter.org






