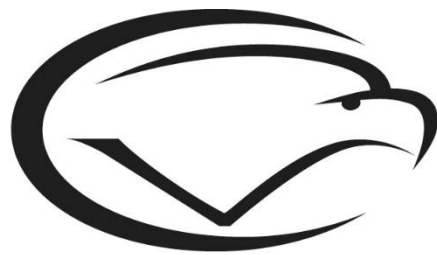

Administrative Awards		Administrative awards are given to Senior Class Officers, National Merit Scholars, Salutatorian, Valedictorian, and those that are entering into the Hall of Fame. All of the students have achieved academic excellence and will leave their mark as they continue their journey after high school graduation.
National Honors Society- Eagle Award of Distinction		The Eagle Award of Distinction is a merit-based scholarship funded by the members of the National Honor Society. Students must have over a 90% grade point average to be eligible, and they must write an essay stating how the four tenets of National Honor Society (Leadership, Character, Scholarship, and Service) have pertained to their lives and to their high school career.
William R. Pierce Memorial Scholarship		The William R. Pierce Memorial Scholarship was established in memory of Bill Pierce following his sudden death in 1991. Mr. Pierce was the principal of Cumberland Valley High School from 1967 -1991. He, his fellow administrators and faculty were instrumental in establishing the reputation of Cumberland Valley as the excellent school it is today. Many programs put in place under his tenure brought recognition to Cumberland Valley throughout the state of PA. Mr. Pierce's focus was to provide a solid education for every student. The criteria established for this scholarship includes a student who has education as their career goal. The student should exhibit honesty, integrity and a desire to work with other students to achieve a common goal.
Senior Academic Excellence Awards		Students selected for this award have maintained an overall GPA of 96% throughout the 4 years they attended Cumberland Valley High School.
United States Air Force Appointment		The United States Air Force Academy appointment is awarded to a student possessing academic and extracurricular excellence. Application to a service academy is endorsed by the student's State Senator and/or Congressman. Students accepted will be serving their country upon completion of their four years of undergraduate work.
United States Marine Corps. Semper Fidelis Award for Musical Excellence Award		In order to be considered for this award you must be: section first chair or an exceptional performer, be a high school junior or senior, be a leader among peers, and be an outstanding young citizen.

<p>United States Army ROTC Scholarship</p>	 ARMY ROTC	<p>Receiving the Army ROTC National Scholarship is the culmination of a process that began several years ago. This year there were over 17,000 applicants for 2800 scholarships nation-wide. This was a very demanding process to select the best candidates and each candidate is very deserving of this selection. The ROTC scholarship is awarded based on three categories Scholastic, Athletic, and Leadership. Students have excelled in all categories throughout high school to earn this scholarship. The ROTC Scholarship will provide full college tuition and mandatory educational fees or room and board. They provide an allowance for textbooks, school supplies, and required equipment. Each month the Cadets receive a monthly stipend. Adding this up, you can see that this scholarship will go a long way toward meeting financial expenses associated with going to college.</p>

<p>The Eagle Foundation: Kevin Noonan Memorial Scholarship</p>		<p>This annual scholarship is offered in memory of Kevin Noonan, a graduate of Cumberland Valley High School (1983) and Penn State University. Kevin was the father of three boys who have been students in the Cumberland Valley School District, an active participant in his community, and was very involved in youth sports. This scholarship will honor his lifelong commitment to his community by recognizing a Cumberland Valley senior who serves the community through leadership in community activities and youth sports. The individual should demonstrate academic success.</p>
<p>The Eagle Foundation: Cumberland Valley Alumni Association Scholarship</p>		<p>In order to build a support system for CV alumni and future graduates, the Eagle Foundation created a school-wide Alumni Association in 2001. Every spring, the Alumni Association offers a scholarship to a child or grand-child of CV alumni who are members of the Association. This is a merit-based scholarship funded by The Mechanicsburg Club.</p>
<p>The Eagle Foundation: Advancement Through Education Scholarship</p>		<p>The Eagle Foundation will award to a Cumberland Valley senior who plans to attend a post-secondary institution, academic achievement of minimum 2.75, employment status and/or community/school involvement. The scholarship will be a one-time award. The check must be applied toward tuition at a post-secondary institution</p>
<p>The Eagle Foundation: Soaring Eagles Scholarships</p>		<p>The Soaring Eagle Scholarship is a character-based scholarship, also funded through a generous gift from The Mechanicsburg Club. The Soaring Eagles program is a recognition program within the high school that provides for the monthly recognition of students based upon character or for their positive contribution to the school or community. All of these recognized students are eligible to apply for the Soaring Eagles Scholarships as seniors. Two Soaring Eagle Scholarships are awarded annually. The Eagle Foundation: Sam Simmons Scholarship		Samuel M. Simmons IV was killed shortly before graduating with the CV class of 1996. He was a Vo-Tech students planning to attend the PA College of Technology to study auto mechanics. His parents, Sam and Suzanne, initiated this scholarship in his memory and to benefit future CV students attending PA College of Technology.
The Eagle Foundation: Peter Craig Breen Memorial Scholarship in Science		The Peter C. Breen Memorial Scholarship in Science was created by his family and friends in memory of Peter, a 2010 CV graduate who loved and excelled in chemistry, math, and music. Peter was humble with a kind and gentle spirit and was happiest when tutoring classmates or younger students. He spent hundreds of hours doing service work as he became an Eagle Scout. Peter attended Penn State and did undergraduate research focusing on RNA and computational chemistry. He was accepted into three Ph.D. programs in Bioinformatics before he passed in 2014.
The Eagle Foundation: Dr. B. Jean Walker Education Scholarship		Each year the Eagle Foundation awards the Dr. B. Jean Walker Education Scholarship to a graduating Cumberland Valley senior who plans to pursue a degree in Education at a 4-year educational institution. This scholarship was initiated in 2008 in memory of Dr. Walker who dedicated her life to educating students. She served as the Cumberland Valley Superintendent from 2003-2007. The CV motto "Soaring to Greatness; Committed to Excellence," captures the essence of her life's work and personal philosophy.
The Eagle Foundation: Erin Knepp Warner Memorial Scholarship		This scholarship was initiated in 2008 in memory of Erin Warner, a 2001 CV graduate, who was on her way to earning a degree in Special Education and help children with special needs when she lost her battle to cancer. This scholarship was established through coordinated efforts of the Knepp and Warner families, along with the assistance of Cumberland Valley Ice Hockey and the School District. Each year, the scholarship is awarded to a senior who plans to pursue a degree in Special Education, Occupational Therapy, or related field.
The Eagle Foundation: Pathway to Success Scholarship		The Pathway to Success scholarship, also funded by The Mechanicsburg Club, is designed to provide financial assistance to a student with particular learning needs. The Pathway to Success scholarship will provide tuition assistance to the recipient who is interested in going on to a traditional higher education institution or completing a certificate program that will enrich his or her life by helping to develop skills that will lead to competitive employment and/or independent living, enhance







		socialization, or in some other way empower the applicant to succeed.
The Eagle Foundation: Audrey W. Harker Memorial Scholarship		<p>The Audrey W. Harker Memorial Scholarship has been established by the Harker family to honor Audrey as a dedicated and loving wife, mother, grandmother, and great grandmother who enjoyed life to the fullest. She was a fun loving and spirited person who delighted in her many life-long friendships with individuals who always enjoyed her company. Her compassion for others was quite remarkable. Five of her grandchildren have graduated from Cumberland Valley and one more will follow. She was both an athlete and a cheerleader in her day. In an untimely circumstance, Audrey lost a courageous battle with cancer in September 2007, but remained upbeat and positive throughout her ordeal in fighting such an insidious disease. Audrey's family wishes to honor and remember her by establishing this annual scholarship in her name to help a Cumberland Valley student achieve a life goal.</p>
The Eagle Foundation: Beth A. Munsch Academic Scholarship		<p>This scholarship has been initiated in memory of Beth Ann Munsch, a dedicated teacher who was committed to helping her students achieve their potential. She was a teacher who put her students first. Beth lost her battle to cancer at the beginning of the 2016-17 school year. Initially stricken with cancer at the end of the 2013 academic year, she continued to teach for three full years while undergoing numerous treatments. She was selfless in her dedication and passion for providing an environment for her students to thrive and learn.</p>
The Eagle Foundation: Buddy Program Academic Scholarship		<p>This scholarship is awarded to a participant in one of the Eagle Foundation's flagship program, the Buddy Program, which was initiated in 1997 to provide active support to select middle and high school students. The program's goal is to provide one-on-one modeling of positive attitudes, work ethic, and problem-solving for students in their academic environment and beyond. The Buddy Program Scholarship, made possible through a generous gift by The Mechanicsburg Club, was created to assist Buddy Program participants in achieving their higher education goals through a two-year scholarship.</p>
Big Brother Big Sisters: Elliot J. Riegler Scholarship		<p>Elliot J. Riegler was a strong supporter of Big Brothers Big Sisters and a member of the Board of Directors; while board president, Dr. Riegler passed away unexpectedly. Upon his death, his family and some members of the community established an endowment; the proceeds of which are used to fund an annual scholarship to honor Dr. Riegler and to aid graduating program participants in their quest for continued education. Wilmer & Patricia Harris Honorary Scholarship		This scholarship has been created in 2020 by Wilmer and Patricia Harris as an initiative to assist a graduating Cumberland Valley student. Mr. Harris spent a total of 38 years employed at Cumberland Valley District, 10 teaching and the last 28 as a School Counselor. This scholarship will recognize their lifelong commitment to education and assisting students to continue to reach goals regardless of obstacles.
Cumberland Valley Education Association Scholarship		The CVEA will award 2 scholarships to graduating seniors who will pursue an education degree in post-high school education.
Cumberland Valley Faculty Scholarship		The CVEA Scholarship is made possible through generous donations from the current faculty. It allows the faculty to give back to the students. Students who are awarded this scholarship are chosen based on need, career direction, character, and/or positive changes they've made throughout their high school years.
Emily Griffie Memorial Scholarship		Emily Griffie loved playing softball for CV. She loved learning, and was planning for college when she tragically lost her life coming home from softball practice in her junior year. Her friends and family are committed to keeping Emily's dreams alive through the Emily Megan Griffie Scholarship, so that her short life can be remembered, and her hopes and dreams fulfilled by others. The scholarship supports students like Emily, who love sports and learning, and strongly desire a college education. Recipients must be a varsity softball player and submit an essay entitled <i>Life Lessons Learned from Softball</i> .
Carlisle Garden Club		The Carlisle Garden Club offers a scholarship to a high school student planning to attend an accredited institution with the intent of earning a degree in horticulture, floriculture, landscape architecture, sustainability, conservation, forestry, botany, agronomy, plant pathology, environmental policy, city planning, land management and/or related issues.

Cantor & Team Orthodontics Award		This scholarship is presented to a student that has been accepted to an accredited two year or four year institution of higher learning and has been active in school activities, community volunteerism, and extra-curricular activities.
Foundation for Enhancing Communities: Home Builders Association of Metropolitan Harrisburg Wayne Yohe Memorial Scholarship		The Home Builders Association of Metropolitan Harrisburg established its Scholarship Program in 1987. Each year this Association awards 10 to 12 - \$1,000 scholarships to local area youth based on academic factors, applicant performance and career goals, with preference given to students furthering their education in the Building Industry or its related fields.
Foundation for Enhancing Communities: Jan DiMartino Delany Memorial Scholarship		The Jan DiMartino Delany Memorial Scholarship is an endowment fund of The Foundation for Enhancing Communities that supports graduating seniors of Cumberland Valley High School attending a two- or four-year institution of higher education. The scholarship is named for the 1975 graduate of Cumberland Valley High School who served as the senior class president and showed remarkable strength in pursuing her career goals despite many hardships. Jan passed award suddenly in 1995 and her family and friends have memorialized her with this scholarship fund.
Foundation for Enhancing Communities: Ely-Wain Scholarship		The Ely-Wain Scholarship Fund of the Foundation for Enhancing Communities was created to provide assistance to Central PA high school seniors pursuing degrees in fields related to environment and sustainability. As more and more people become conscious of how humans are affecting the planet, and as green technology continues to grow, there are burgeoning opportunities for college graduates to make a living protecting the Earth. The scholarship is meant to recognize young women and men who aspire to make a difference as well as a salary.
Foundation for Enhancing Communities: Erin L. Jenkins Memorial Scholarship		This award memorializes Erin L. Jenkins, a Cumberland Valley student who died from injuries she received in an auto accident in 1999. Erin was a joyful child who always had a smile on her face. She loved horses, field hockey, family, and friends. After her death, her young classmates lobbied to get a traffic light installed at the dangerous intersection where her accident occurred. Inspired by this success, Bruce and Kitty Jenkins established this scholarship to support Cumberland Valley students whose unselfish actions have benefited the community.

Foundation for Enhancing Communities: McInroy-Sheffer People Trust		The McInroy-Sheffer People Trust Fund is for students graduating from a high school in one of the eligible counties in PA, including Cumberland county. Students must be enrolled in HACC, Mansfield University, Central Pennsylvania College, York College, Pennsylvania College of Technology, or Harrisburg University and plan to study one of the eligible subject areas.
Foundation for Enhancing Communities: St. Hilaire French Award		The St. Hilaire French Scholarship Fund of the Foundation for Enhancing Communities has been established for those who have an interest in pursuing the study and furthering the use of this beautiful romance language, which is spoken throughout the world. It is widely recognized and highly utilized as a language of preference in international business and diplomacy. The Fund specifically benefits graduating seniors from Cumberland Valley High School who have plans to study French as a major or minor at a college or university, or who have plans to study in a summer program in the province of Québec, Canada.
Foundation for Enhancing Communities: Roberta L. Houpt Scholarship		The Roberta L. Houpt Scholarship Fund is an endowment fund of The Foundation for Enhancing Communities. The scholarship is awarded to students from Cumberland, Dauphin, and Perry Counties studying nursing at a college or university of their choice. This scholarship fund was established in 1998 by Lyndell S. Houpt, a long time secretary of the Camp Hill High School, in loving memory of her daughter Roberta L. Houpt, a nurse who served in the Vietnam War and was the first Nurse Practitioner in Pennsylvania. In addition to a desire to pursue a career in nursing, applicants must demonstrate academic achievement, service to the community, and financial need.
The Hall Foundation Merit Scholarship Award		The criteria for selection of the student(s) is to include academic achievement (top 25% of the class), demonstration of leadership, personal service to school and community and has financial need. Post high school educational pursuits will include 2-4 year college programs, technical programs or qualified trade programs.
Hampden Township Veterans Scholarship		This scholarship is being offered to a high school senior attending a public, charter, parochial, or private high school, or home school. In addition to meeting the prerequisites of qualification, finalists will be selected based on scholastic achievements and extracurricular activities in and out of school. Prerequisites: The applicant must be a resident of Hampden Township, Cumberland County, Pennsylvania, and meet at least one of the following three criteria: 1. Be a son or daughter of a parent who honorably served or is currently serving in the United States military. 2. Be an active participant in a JROTC program. 3. Demonstrated

		through participation in community programs, service groups, or individual volunteer efforts a commitment to honor and respect all military veterans who have served their country in time of peace or war.
HMMS Youth Soccer Scholarships		HMMS Soccer Club awards three scholarships per year. The recipients include one male player, one female player and a third individual we refer to as our "President's Selection". All three will have been accepted to an accredited college, university, and trade or business school for 2018-2019. They must have demonstrated a commitment to our club and in good standing with the policies and by-laws of HMMS. The scholarships are determined by way of three criteria: years of service as a player, referee and/or volunteer, how you have given back your time and talent to HMMS and/or youth soccer in general and an essay detailing your own "Life Lessons Learned from Soccer".
Kiwanis of the West Shore Foundation		This scholarship is awarded based on academic achievements, community service, leadership, special talents, unique endeavors and obstacles overcome in fulfilling their education. Members of Key Club are given priority.
Mechanicsburg North Rotary Scholarship		Rotary is a worldwide organization connecting 1.2 million business and professional leaders from more than 200 countries and geographical areas. Rotarians provide humanitarian service, encourage high ethical standards in all vocations, and help build goodwill and peace through projects at the local, national, and international level. The Rotary Club of Mechanicsburg North honors 12 students from Cumberland Valley High School throughout the year as the Rotary Students of the Month. These students' academic, extracurricular, and civic accomplishments all strongly exhibit the principles of Rotary.
The Charles H. Jr., and Jane Eagle Diller Scholarship Fund		Mr. Diller is committed to helping students in any discipline at Shippensburg University, but specifically in the John L. Grove College of Business, develop as entrepreneurs by providing the necessary support and learning environment which will encourage entrepreneurship. He has graciously provided for the Charles H. Jr., and Jane Eagle Diller Scholarship Fund for Cumberland Valley High School Students
PSECU- John J. Marisic Scholarship		John was a longtime member of the PSECU Board of Directors and served as the Vice Chairman for a period of time. He was an active board member and was very involved in community events. He was the embodiment of the mission of credit unions to serve the greater good. This scholarship is awarded to the top applicant in honor of John's dedication to PSECU and commitment to improving the community.

Eagle View Middle School PTO Scholarship		Each year, the middle schools in this district provide a scholarship to a graduating Cumberland Valley High School student who attended their particular school. The following factors determine qualification for the Eagle View Middle School PTO Scholarship: the student must have been a student at Eagle View Middle School for at least two years, and be a member of the current CV High School senior class and the applicant must be accepted by and plan to enroll in a college or post-secondary school for the next academic year.
Good Hope Middle School PTO Scholarship		The Good Hope MS PTO organization is offering two scholarships to graduating seniors having attended Good Hope Middle School for at least 3 academic school years, who is accepted to or has plans to attend a college, technical school or other post-secondary school within the next academic year and who demonstrates a financial need.

Hampden Elementary School PTO Scholarship		Hampden Elementary PTO awards two scholarships to one female recipient and one male recipient. Selection criteria includes academic accomplishments, extracurricular activities, community service and leadership qualities.
Middlesex Elementary PTO Scholarship- Beverly Peterson Memorial Scholarship		We are proud to offer the Beverly Peterson Memorial Scholarship annually in memory of Bev Peterson, who was an active member of the Middlesex community and a PTO president in the early 1990's. It was in light of her death that the Middlesex PTO decided to use her example as a guide in determining which student would receive a scholarship from the committee.
Monroe Elementary School PTO Scholarship		The Monroe Elementary PTO is proud to provide a scholarship for a 2018 graduating senior who has been accepted to a four year college or university program.
