CURRICULUM INCLUDES 31 IB COURSES, 28AP COURSES, 27 HONORS COURSES AND 14 COLLEGE CREDIT COURSES

THE SCHOOL:

The Cumberland Valley High School serves the four townships of Hampden, Middlesex, Monroe and Silver Spring in Cumberland County. The area included in the school system extends from Carlisle to Camp Hill, Pennsylvania. This area is essentially rural and suburban and is located fifteen miles west of Harrisburg. The school operates with a total of five principals; two associate principals overseeing 9th through 12th grades and a dean of students. The combined junior-senior high school opened in September 1954 to 800 students. The school has steadily grown since that time. Current statistics for 9th through 12th grade are:

CLASS PERIODS:

Nine class periods are scheduled daily. Periods are 41 minutes in length, on a 6-day cycle for major subjects, 36 weeks a year.

CURRICULUM

In order for a student to graduate from Cumberland Valley High School he/she must complete the following: four credits in English, three credits in social studies, three credits in science, three credits in math, with two additional credits in math or science, one and a half credits in health/physical education. Electives and integrated arts make up the balance of the twenty-three credits required for graduation.

CURRICULUM BY DEPARTMENT

INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE PROGRAM—English, History, Psychology, Sports Exercise & Health, Chemistry, Math, Math Studies, Math Applications, Math Analysis, French, Spanish, German, Art, Theory of Knowledge, Visual Arts

<u>DUAL ENROLLMENT</u>—Students with approval attend classes off campus at nearby colleges for high school and college credit.

COLLEGE CREDIT COURSES: Accounting 101, Computer Applications 105. Business 101, Marketing 201, English 101, English 102, Communications 101, Economics 201, History 101, History 102, History 103, History 104, Math 103, Biology 111.

WORLD LANGUAGE: AP French, AP German, AP Spanish & AP Spanish Literature. Six years of French, Spanish and German, taught in the traditional and audio-lingual methods.

MATHEMATICS: AP Calculus AB and BC, AP Computer Science, AP Statistics Computer Science Programming, Pre-Algebra, Algebra 1 and 2, Geometry, Calculus. Pre-Calculus/Trig. Business Math, Financial Algebra and Statistics.

SCIENCE: AP Physics 1 & C, AP Chemistry, AP Biology AP Environmental Science, Environmental Science, Biology, Physics, Conceptual Physics, Anatomy/Physiology, Chemistry I, Conceptual Chemistry, Astronomy, Biochemistry, IRIS (Independent Research in Science), Wildlife Biology & Ecology, Zoology & Botany, and Oceanography & Meteorology

SOCIAL STUDIES: AP Human Geography, AP World History AP Psychology, AP Government, AP Economics AP U.S. History. World History is required in grade nine. Tenth, and eleventh, students take a combination of Government, Economics, US History. Electives include Sociology, Psychology, Global Issues & Anthropology.

ENGLISH: AP English Lit. & Comp., AP English Language. English 9, 10, 11 and 12 must be taken by all students. American Literature 11, World Literature 12.

BUSINESS EDUCATION: Introduction to Business, Accounting 1 and 2, Entrepreneurship 1 and 2, Microsoft Office classes, Business Law, Cooperative Education, Web Page Design, Sports & Entertainment Marketing. Personal Money Mgt., All business courses are elective to all students. Also offered are internship opportunities.

ART & MUSIC: AP Art History, AP Studio Art Drawing, AP 2D, AP 3D are offered as well as 20 Art electives. AP Music Theory is offered as well as 19 additional Music courses.

<u>**TECHNOLOGY**</u> – Fifteen technology courses are available including Project Lead The Way (PLTW); Principals of Engineering, Civil Engineering, Digital Electronics, Engineering Design & Development, CAD, Tech Support & Security

ADDITIONAL ELECTIVES: Electives are offered in Family & Consumer Sciences, and our Agriculture Department. The school yearbook, school newspaper and school television station are also offered to all students as electives. A JROTC Program is offered with four levels.

VOCATIONAL COURSES: Cumberland Valley is a member of Cumberland-Perry Vocational Technical School. Selected students who elect this program will attend this school on a half-day basis in grades 9-12.
