Why Career Pathways @ CV?

- Approximately 80% of CV graduates are accepted to college.
- Of those CV graduates who enroll in college, only 50% of them have earned a bachelor's degree within six years of high school graduation.
- The average Pennsylvanian from the HS class of 2018 has \$35,759 in student debt.*
- Don't plan to graduate... graduate with a plan!

Career Pathways

A collection of rigorous, high-quality courses, workforce preparation activities, and other educational experiences organized around a cluster of careers that share similar characteristics and have common employment requirements. Students select a career pathway that best fits their interests and abilities, aligns with their career goals, and enhances their ability to enter or advance within a specific occupation cluster.

Diploma Certificates

Workforce Ready Certificate

- Minimum of 4 credits in a CV Designated Pathway or 5 credits in a Student Designed Pathway.
- Career & Post-Secondary Studies Certificate: Students are prepared for post-secondary education
 - Minimum of 4 credits in a CV Designated Pathway or 8 credits in a Student Designed Pathway.
 - Recommended to pursue credit from AP, IB, CPAVTS, or other post-secondary/industry courses.

Advanced Post-Secondary Studies Certificate: Student is ready to transition to a highly competitive college or university.

- Minimum of 10 credits in honors, AP, IB, Dual Enrollment, and/or College in the High School Courses.
- Minimum of 8 credits in a Student Designed Pathway

What does this mean for students?

Class of 2020

Current juniors may apply for diploma certificates based on their existing transcripts. They will be able to apply for the diploma certificate prior to graduation by completing an application showing that they have met all the requirements of the particular diploma certificate.

Class of 2021

- Current sophomores are encouraged but not required to select a career pathway and diploma endorsement.
- Students who select a career pathway and diploma endorsement are encouraged to select their 2019-2020 courses based on those goals.

What should you do with your student now?

Help your student to begin thinking about their career goals. Is picking a career pathway and diploma certificate right fit those goals?

If choosing a career pathway indicate it on your student's course selection form and pick your 2019-2020 courses based upon that career pathway.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

- 23 total credits to graduate from CV
 - 4 credits in English
 - 3 credits in Social Studies
 - 3 credits in Science
 - 3 credits in Math
 - 2 additional credits from any combination in Social Studies, Science and/or Math
 - 1.5 credits in Health & PE
 - completion of PA Keystone Exams
 - Juniors must schedule <u>6.5 credits</u>
 - Seniors must schedule <u>4 credits</u>

Course Formats

AP / IB / L2 / L3 (Traditional format)

Semester 3

- College in the High School / Dual Enrollment
- Early College Admissions
- Early Graduation
- Blended Courses

Semester III – Accelerated Courses in Summer

- Open to students to all high school students (as long as course requisites are met).
- Limit 2 credits
- Blended format
- 6 week course (60 hours of face to face for full credit)
- 3 week courses (30 hours of face to face for ¹/₂ credit)
- Approximately 2 hours of homework each night

Semester III – Accelerated Courses Continued

- American Govt (.5 credit)
- Economics (.5 credit)
- Contemp. Global Issues
- United States History
- American Literature 11
- World Literature 12
- Geometry
- Chemistry
- Strength Training (PE)
- First Aid, CPR, and AED (PE)
- Heavy Equipment Operator

College in the High School (CIHS) /Dual Enrollment Program

- Agreement with HACC for students to gain college credit as a student at Cumberland Valley
- Classes are taught by HACC or CV faculty
- Dual Enrollment Cost is \$125 per credit (\$375 total cost per class)
- CIHS Cost is \$75 per credit (\$225 total)
- Grades based on the college grading scale
- <u>Courses:</u> refer to Program of Studies (POS)
 - English, Social Studies, Math, Science, Business

College in the High School/Dual Enrollment

Some courses have book fees.

- HACC placement test and teacher recommendation
- NCAA approved
- HACC application (on HACC website)

Early College Admission

- Program designed for seniors who want to complete their 12th grade required classes at college
- School Board approval is required
- Students are responsible for tuition and transportation (do not qualify for Financial Aid)
- Application due March 1st of Junior Year

Early Graduation

Must meet all graduation requirements using Semester 3 courses or doubling up during the school year

Blended Learning

- Traditional class setting every other cycle day
- Alternate cycle days are online for independent learning time in the Learning Commons.
- Courses listed in Program of Studies
 - Government, Economics, US History, AP US History, CGI, World Literature (12), American Literature (11), H. Anatomy & Physiology, Geometry, Algebra 2, Statistics, AP Statistics, German 1, & H. German 3.
 - Paired
 - American Lit / US History
 - World Lit / CGI


